Life Line Screening

Our Savior's has agreed to host a Life Line Screening on February 16. There is a simple, convenient way for you to get preventive health screenings and learn your risk for stroke, heart disease and other chronic conditions. Four tests are included: Carotid Artery Screening (plaque), Peripheral Arterial Disease Screening, Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm, and Atrial Fibrillation.

Life Line Screening does not participate in the Medicare program and the cost of our screening services is not covered by reimbursable Medicare. Life Line Screening does not file insurance claims nor provide referrals to any physician's group or hospital. If you are unable to attend the screening for any reason whatsoever, Life Line will issue a gift card for the full amount to be used by you, or anyone you choose for future screening services.
