### From the Pastor's Desk

Death is hard. That isn't to say that death isn't sometimes peaceful or contented or even a blessing. But for those left behind, the reality is still ugly and painful. We have all of these connections, all of this love, all of this relationship, and suddenly it's gone. Things are lost that can't be retrieved. If a couple loses a child, they can't just have another child and have it all be okay. How many of you have stopped having pets because it's too painful to lose another one? And as much as I love my pup, and y'all know I do (possibly way too much), she's my pup, not my child. It's not the same. The loss of an important person in our lives leaves a big hole, one that we can never fill up quite the same way again. It's like when you break a cup. You can repair it, but it'll never be like it once was. The scar of the break will always be there. Some things can't be undone.

Unless of course, your name is Lazarus and you are friends with Jesus. But even in the case of Lazarus, as someone pointed out, "It's a temporary fix to a permanent problem." Lazarus could still catch a cold the next day. Life doesn't stop being life. We catch diseases and we inflict pain on each other. Look at what humanity did to Jesus and to his disciples. Even look at the family of Lazarus for people hurting each other. Martha wants Mary publicly rebuked for listening to Jesus rather than helping out. Later, Mary's pain causes her to lash out at Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." We excel at hurting each other in ways large and small. It seems it's what we do with our own pain and bitterness. And this is the life that people would ask why God doesn't extend it for them.

But what God offers is something different, not just an extension of this life, but new life, eternal life. Something as different from your body as that of the resurrected Christ. A new city and a new Earth. A world where God dwells in the midst of the people, caring for and comforting them. A world where God will wipe every tear from their eyes, not in a blank erasure of what they have been through, but in a gesture of tenderest love, in mercy and comfort, and an acknowledgement of their pain, where a chance is given to have a fresh relationship no longer bound by pain and fear, no longer shadowed by death. A world where love doesn't stop at the grave. Where

death loses its power. Where fear, shame, and pain have no hold and where bitterness has no place. But a place where comfort is given, and love, mercy, and compassion rule. One where God brings together all of God's people, not just those here and now, but of all times and all places. Where all the saints are joined together at the table. Where the great cloud of witnesses is made manifest.

We seek what we already know, but slightly longer, slightly better. What God offers us is something more. God offers us an entirely new way of being and relating. Not just less suffering or an absence of pain, but the presence of love and compassion. And no longer the shadow of death, but the presence of God in the midst of the people. Not just to break chains, but to wipe away tears. To no longer be separated by the grave, but united in Christ. That is God's promise. To gather all God's people, not just this tiny band here and now, but to gather all of the saints. To be together at the feast that is to come. To be as one in God. Of all languages, and colors, and dress, and worship styles, of all football teams, of all political beliefs, all understandings, of all denominations, of all times and places. All united by God's love and care to be the saints in truth.
